

Inquiry Project




The aim of the Air Balloon Curriculum is for children to understand why the world is like it is and explore how we can make it better. We achieve this through a series of inquiry projects. The inquiry approach provides a context through which the children will acquire knowledge and develop skills that will enable them to respond to the inquiry in a meaningful way. Each inquiry has a lead subject (typically science, history or geography) with additional subjects contributing to the inquiry's key themes.

Times Table Rockstars

When it comes to times tables, speed AND accuracy are important – the more facts your child remembers, the easier it is for them to do harder calculations.

Times Table Rock Stars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help students master the times tables!

In Year 6, teachers will set their class a TTRockstars session each week between 15 and 25 minutes.

Part of this can be completed during ICT slots. There is an expectation that around half the session is completed at home.

Following their results from their session, teachers can identify a TTRockstar of the week based on improved scores, timing or coins earnt

Spelling Expectations

Children will bring home a list of words each term to practise for our Spelling Bee competition.

These word lists consist of:

- words from the common exception words and statutory word lists for Year 5 & 6
- words linked to the spelling patterns being taught in class during spelling lessons.
- Please bear in mind that SATs SPaG assessment will also include spellings from Year 3 & 4.

Reading at Home



Children should read a minimum of 3 times a week for at least 10 minutes.

When you read at home please also discuss what has been read. This is what makes the real difference to children's progress.

Reading records <u>must</u> be signed 3 times a week.

SATS



The 2024 KS2 SATs will take place in the week commencing 13th May 2024. The tests will take place over four days (Monday to Thursday). Please ensure that your child is here for these dates.

Children in Year 6 will take these tests in their normal school classrooms. SATs Papers will be taken in Maths, Reading and SPaG under formal exam conditions.

Online Safety information for parents



2023 Pupil survey - Y6



- 78% of pupils have a mobile phone
- 65% pupils say they spend most of their time online in their bedroom
- 8% report being supervised when they are online

Social media - Y6



- 88% have a social media account
- 59% WhatsApp
- 41% TikTok
- 20% SnapChat

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Online Safety-T6



- 33% of pupils in Y5 have their real name on their account
- 22% have their real photo
- 78% do not have private settings (uniform, houses, names, strangers as followers)
- 61% have seen or experienced unsafe, unkind or disrespectful behaviour online
- 57% have reported to a trusted adult
- 20% would be happy for a parent or teacher to see all of their online behaviour

Common issues



- Unkindness on game chat (e.g. Xbox live)
- SnapChat messages, group chats, inappropriate language, stories, location)
- TikTok fake account, multiple accounts (with minimal security) and leaving unkind comments.
- WhatsApp group chats starting lots of chats, excluding people, adding people when they don't to be, being unkind to people who are/aren't present

Types of unkindness include name calling, racist remarks, sexual references, misogynistic remarks and threats of violence.
