Part 1 - Key messages this week

Choral Choir

Yesterday we welcomed Rev Pippa White from St Aidan's along with some Choral Scholars to lead two assemblies with KS2 pupils to introduce a pop-up choir that will be running for 4 weeks at the beginning of Term 6. The choir will be free and open to up-to 30 pupils who would like to experience singing choral music in a choir. Sessions will be led by a professional choral conductor and will take place on Wednesdays from 3.20 to 4.10pm.

Please note that spaces will be available on a first-come, first-served basis and children have to commit to attending all 4 sessions. A small concert will be held for parents and carers at the end of the last session on 15th May. You can sign-up via Arbor.

Attendance Update

As you may have seen in the news over the last couple of weeks, the Government has issued updated attendance guidance for schools which will become statutory in September 2024. Below is a summary of the main changes:

Fines for absences (for example term-time holidays) will rise from £60 to £80, or £160 if not paid within 21 days. This will apply to absences of 5 or more days (10 sessions) in a rolling 10-week period. In a significant change to the current legislation, only two fines can be issued to the same parent for the same child within a three-year rolling period. If a second fine is issued this will automatically be charged at £160. If there is a third period of absence which would previously have incurred a fine, alternative action would be taken – most likely prosecution which is a more formal legal action.

There are also several changes planned to attendance codes which schools use to identify the broad reasons for an absence and which you might see on your child's attendance certificate. There are a number of sub-codes being introduced to support attendance code analysis but the key change is that the **H** code (currently used to identify holidays that have been authorised by the school) is being removed from use – term-time absences for holidays will now either be coded as **C** for exceptional circumstances or **G** for holidays that have not been authorised. The coding guidance from the Department for Education is also much more specific about what constitutes an exceptional circumstance and states "Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance."

Bristol City Council will issue updated guidance in due course – including updated Penalty Notice Code of Conduct, model attendance policy and guidance for schools and parents. We will share all of this information with you as and when it becomes available.

These are the biggest changes to school attendance since penalty notices were introduced in September 2013 and are central to the Department for Education's drive to improve school attendance and pupil outcomes.


Library News

Entry to all of the discos will be via the door in the front playground (nearest the library window / lost property). Parents are welcome to wait in the front yard (outside of the main office) during the discos but will not be allowed to stay in the hall. We will have plenty of staff at the discos to help the children.

Collection from the discos at the end will be via the main entrance and into the hall, exiting the hall from the door in the topleft corner. Children will be waiting in the hall at the end of each disco. In order to ease congestion in the hall at the end of the discos, we will ask parents to collect their child a year-group at a time – please wait at the main entrance until you are called in to collect.

When queuing for the start of the discos, please line-up in the front playground and we will tick names off our lists in advance of the children heading into the discos so that there is no delay in them getting in as soon as it starts.

The Year 5/6 Disco will also have a small tuck shop for children to buy additional snacks – children at this disco ONLY can bring £1 with them to spend.

In addition, Wednesday 27th March will be a non-uniform day (with a suggested donation of £1 to FAB). This will also make it easier for the younger children attending the discos as they won't need to change out of their uniforms before heading to the dance-floor!

School Closure - 2nd May

As outlined in the letter from Mr Browse earlier this term, school will be closed on Thursday 2nd May as it is to be used as a polling station.

We were informed of the decision to use Air Balloon as a polling station by Bristol City Council Electoral Services earlier this year. We have asked them to consider alternative sites but no other site in the local area matches their criteria. A risk assessment was also undertaken to see if it would be feasible to open parts of the school (including space cadets) but unfortunately this will not be possible. We are also unable to re-allocate any of the school's inset days to the date of the local elections.

All parents and carers will therefore need to find alternative childcare on Thursday 2nd May.

The school will provide some home learning for children to complete and we will also provide a school packed lunch for children who receive free school meals. Details of this will be shared nearer the time.

We apologise for the disruption this will cause to your child's time at school and for any inconvenience it causes families.


